# **Flat Roof Blind Fitting Instructions**



## Mounting

When mounting the standard and motor/chain drive profile make sure that the distance between the clip and the end of the pleated blinds is 50 or 65 mm. Use only one clip per cord and/or drilled hole.


No countersunk screws may be used for fixing.

Recommendation: DIN 7981 Ø3.8 x 16 mm
(for wooden and synthetic frames)

Standardprofile

Motor/chain drive profile

Installation: Insert the profile in the upper edge of the clip and press in downwards (until it clicks).




When **dismounting**, push the flap of the clip upwards to be able to take the profile out of the clip.

#### Mounting

Please ensure that there is a gap of at least 100 mm between the pleated blind and the glass pane to ensure sufficient ventilation. Furthermore, allowance should be made for ventilation gaps.

If the air circulation is inadequate, this may lead to heat accumulation and the formation of condensation.


Mounting with clip



## Operation


Tensioned pleated blinds are opened and closed by moving the operating handle, using the control rod to help if necessary.

Attach the control rod to the operating handle.



## Tensioning of wire

Final wire tensioning carried out <u>after</u> installation of the pleated



- 1. Secure the end of the wire by hand or using pliers.
- 2. Release the screw slightly (turn angle screwdriver anti-clockwise)
- 3. Tension the wire (by hand or use pliers).
- 4. Tighten the screw (turn angle screwdriver clockwise).
- Final tensioning of the wire is achieved by further tightening of the wire stretcher.

For pleated blinds with more than one wire, repeat steps 1 to 5.

Note: Tension all wires evenly.

#### **Fitting of Side Profiles**

The side profile do not have pre-drilled holes as we do not know where these need to be in relation to where you fit the blind.

**NOTE:** If your plaster is slightly out it may allow a small amount of light around the side profiles. You may want to use decorators caulk to fill this gap. We do not recommend silicone.
